

## **Brief Description of Subject:**

English Language is a well-established and highly popular subject at Weymouth College. The area is taught through linguistic analysis of language and theoretical positions from Language Study. The assessment is as follows at AS level:

- Paper 1 = Language and The Individual 11/2 hour exam; worth 50% of AS level
- Paper 2 = Language Varieties 11/2 hour exam; 50% of AS level

And at A level:

- Paper 1: Language, the Individual and Society 21/2 hour exam; 40% of A level
- Paper 2: Language Diversity and Change 21/2 hour exam:40% of A Level
- Non- Exam Assessment: Language in Action coursework folder; 20% of A Level.
