Course summary

- Progression from Level two is essential, you will also need to have completed your function skills or GCSEs and have a good attendance record.
- You will be required to complete a trades test to prove your skills and readiness for the next level.
- The course is one year long
- You will complete practical assessment, assignments and exams over the year. The practical assessments will take place in a realistic working environment.
- You will develop a range of skills, techniques, personal qualities and attitudes essential for the hairdressing industry.
- The qualification is nationally recognised and you will be work ready as a Junior stylist on completion.

- Creative cutting
 - Creative Colouring
- Advanced perming techniques
- Creative hair design
- Promote products and services
- Colour correction



Industry experience

- During Level three we will provide as much industry experience for you as possible, this could include:
 - Guest speakers
 - In-house competitions
 - The annual show
 - Workshops
 - Trip and visits
- You will also be required to do work experience and source a placement to carry this out
- We encourage you to find a employment in a salon, this could be as a junior or doing voluntary work in a salon setting. Although this is not compulsory, it is highly recommended.



Progression

- **After Level three is completed you may consider the following:**
 - Barbering
 - Employment in a salon
 - Mobile hairdressing
- **When you have experienced the industry you could also consider:**
 - Cruise liners
 - Hairdressing manufacturers (rep)
 - Teaching
 - Specialist work such as hair extensions or trichology.

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Frequently Asked Questions

- How many days a week will I be at college?
 - Approximately 3 days a week in college and one independent study day.
- Will I have to purchase additional kit?
 - Yes, this is approximately £150, you may need to replace any lost/broken kit from L2 and will be discussed at enrolment.
- Will I have the opportunity to resit my GCSEs?
 - Yes, unless you already have English and Maths at Grade 4, GCSE retakes will be built into your timetable.
- What is college life like?
 - College is an adult learning environment. We will support you in all aspects of your learning, however as an adult learner we want you take responsibility for your learning. You will have to ensure you are organised and adhere to all assessment deadlines.
- Will my attendance and punctuality be monitored?
 - Yes the hair department instil the highest regards for attendance and punctuality as this is required in the workplace. Your tutor will monitor your attendance weekly.
- Can I access extra help at college?
 - Yes, speak with your tutor at enrolment, induction or throughout any part of your course to gain extra help
