

### Apprenticeship Cash Bonuses

From 1st September 2020, employers that take on a new apprentice can apply for a cash bonus, via the Apprenticeship System. The new apprentice must not have been a previous employee within the last six months and must have started an apprenticeship with effect from 1st August 2020 to 31st January 2021.

### For a 16-18 year old

A £2000 bonus is available for each new apprentice. This is in addition to the £1000 employer incentive already in place.

#### For a 19-24 year old

A £2000 bonus is also available for each new apprentice.

#### For a 25+ year old

A £1500 bonus is available for each new apprentice.

These cash bonuses are available to all employers regardless of size and whether they are levy or non-levy.

Payment will be provided in two instalments, the first payment will be issued after the apprentice has been employed for 90 days with the second payment after 365 days.

# **Kickstart Scheme**

This is being launched to create hundreds and thousands of new, fully subsidised jobs for young people across the country. Those aged 19-24, claiming Universal Credit and at risk of long-term unemployment, will be eligible.

Funding will be available with effect from the 1st August to 31st January 2021 for each six-month iob placement and will cover 100% of the National Minimum Wage for 25 hours a week - employers will be able to top this wage up.

## **Traineeships**

These courses are for 16-18 year olds and include a work placement and support toward developing Mathematics and English skills. An employer taking on a trainee as part of a traineeship will be paid £1000 per trainee. Traineeships help to get an individual ready for an apprenticeship or job if they don't have the appropriate skills or experience.

# **Job Retention Bonus**

This will be introduced from 1st August 2020 and is to help employers retain furloughed workers. UK Employers will receive a one-off bonus of £1,000 for each furloughed employee who is still employed as of 31st January 2021.
