Students will be taught how to explore a variety of traditional and digital photography and related media. The course will begin to develop the artistic and technical skills needed for working within the lens based creative and digital industries. An important part of the course will be the exploration and experimentation with traditional photography in our purpose built darkroom. Students will be encouraged to consider photography both historically and in contemporary contexts. Students will examine and explore how the photographic image communicates with the viewer in our visually rich culture.



What are the course entry requirements?

Level 3 UAL diploma in Photography

You will be expected to have achieved 5 GCSEs at grade 4 or above including art or photography, English language or equivalent and Maths.

We will also accept a BTEC First Diploma or other related level 2 qualification at Merit or higher

You will be required to bring a portfolio of work to interview.



What will you expect from me?

To Achieve a full qualification to the highest standard we ask for:

A high level of attendance

Punctuality and meeting deadlines

Commitment to the course and respect for colleagues and staff

A drive and self discipline suitable for your level of course

Independent study

Engagement in visits, experiences, opportunities and shows



Work Experience and organised study trips

We offer a range of experiences across the department which includes a programme of Visiting artists from a wide range of backgrounds and disciplines and the possibility of external trips.

In addition to this all of our students take part in a whole department Arts Festival. This forms part of our industry work experience where students work alongside an external professional artists through a series of workshops which culminates in an exciting Arts festival off site.

Students are encouraged to engage in external activities such as competitions, community projects and volunteering opportunities such as those through B-Side festival.

The academic year culminates in an exhibition of work from across the courses which is open to the public.

Progression Routes

Successful students can progress through the levels of courses, into relevant industry training or to Higher Education, including the colleges own

Foundation Diploma in Art & Design or Foundation Degree in Art and Design.
