On Friday evening, the Department for Education and the examinations regulator Ofqual, launched joint consultations seeking views from members of the public on their proposals for the awarding of grades for this academic year for GCSE, AS, A Level, and separately for vocational qualifications. These consultations close on Friday 29th January 2021. We remain committed to ensure that you all receive the grades that you deserve, and we will of course be responding to this consultation, both as individual members of staff and as a College. Of course, it is you who are most affected by these decisions and we therefore feel that it is incredibly important that you have the opportunity to read and respond to these consultations.
