

## **Dear Students**

As you can imagine we have had an extremely busy week planning and preparing for return to College. Can I also remind you to bring your masks with you at all times for testing as well as full return, as you know you will be required to wear your mask in all communal areas and in classrooms where the guidelines for 2m social distancing is not possible. As previously mentioned if you are exempt from wearing a mask, we will be able to provide you with a protective visor at your testing appointment. Please discuss this when you arrive at the testing facility.

Dear Student,

I hope this email finds you well. I am writing to you following the email that was sent on 27<sup>th</sup> February to explain our College process for booking your **1**<sup>st</sup> **asymptomatic test** in preparation for you to return to face-to-face teaching.

Please note that there will be further instructions explaining how to book your 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> test with guidance on home testing from the 19<sup>th</sup> March once you are back on College site.

## **Asymptomatic Testing**

As previously explained, the government have introduced Lateral Flow testing for staff and students – you will be required to participate in this testing before you return on site. Initially, we will be required to oversee the first three Lateral Flow Device (LFD) tests which you will administer ('self-swab'), each of these tests must be conducted between three and five days apart onsite, at College.

Tests will take place in the Sports hall (Worbarrow Building). You may be interested to watch this video on YouTube which explains in a little more detail how the test is administered – it is very simple and nothing to be worried about: (Link here)

Please note - given the staggered arrival of students for their first test, and the requirement that no student can resume face-to-face lessons until they have received a negative LFD test result, this means that lessons/lectures will resume **the day after** the initial test with **remote delivery** continuing on Monday 8<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup>. On the day of their initial test:

- Students will be set consolidation work for completion at home.
- The testing area is located in the main sports hall, Worbarrow building, Cranford Avenue DT4 7LQ.
- We are unable to accommodate students on site who are waiting for their test slot, so please arrive on site no more than 10 mins before the chosen time, and leave site immediately after testing is completed.

Your Lateral Flow test schedule is outlined below:

- 1<sup>st</sup> Lateral Flow test Wednesday 10th March
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Lateral Flow test Monday 15th March (5 days between tests)
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Lateral Flow test Thursday 18th March (3 days between tests)

In order to manage the programme of testing, and maintain the existing protocols for limiting contact between students and staff we need you book your slot for your 1<sup>st</sup> test using the below link:

## **Positive LFD Test Result**

If you identify as having a positive LFD test, you will be required to self-isolate for a period of 10 days as will those members of our community who have also been identified as 'close-contacts'. Members of the your household who test positive will also be required to self-isolate in line with current <u>guidance for households</u> with possible coronavirus infection. You will also be required to take a PCR test, available from your usual local Covid-19 testing facilities.
