Answer the following:

- 1. What is the difference between *watching* a film and *analysing* a film? Describe in your own words what you imagine a student does when they analyse a film clip.
- 2. Choose a favourite film. Research how this was **marketed**. Include in your research as a word document or powerpoint the poster images (note where these appeared if possible), DVD/ blue ray jacket covers, articles and note where these appeared if possible), interviews about the film/with key actors, any awards it received, what profit it made or was it financially unsuccessful.
- 3. What does Art House cinema mean? And name 4 examples.
- 4. What are independent films? And name 3 examples.
- 5. What are the differences between British and American Films? Name an example for each.
- 6. What does genre mean? List 5 film genres. Give an example of a film for each genre.


