What is sexual abuse?

A young person is sexually abused when they are forced or persuaded to take part in sexual activities. They may not understand that they are being abused. This does not have to be physical contact, and it can happen online. Non-contact abuse covers other acts where the abuser does not touch the young person, such as grooming, exploitation, and persuading young people to perform sexual acts over the internet.
