This document will continually be reviewed as per the changes to the Governments advice.

On the 20th March 2020 the UK government in response to the coronavirus pandemic (designated by the World Health Organization as COVID-19) introduced a lockdown of the working population, except for persons identified as Key Workers. This was as a medical control measure to reduce the spread of the virus and to enable resources to be allocated to those who are infected and maintain essential services for running the country. As the pandemic evolves together with scientific knowledge of the virus, advice is being issued and amended almost daily. It is imperative that you keep up to date with the latest advice on Coronavirus (COVID-19).

This follows on from the revised risk assessment dated 19/8/21. The college continues to deliver face to face high quality education to all students in line with the government guidance. However, it may become necessary to reintroduce 'bubbles' for a temporary period, to reduce mixing between groups.

29/11/21 Due to advice from the Government C°2 monitors are now being installed in each classroom across site to monitor the levels of C°2. If the reading goes into the 'RED' then tutors are advised to open the doors and windows which should reduce the levels of C°2.

The Government have reinstated the mandatory instruction to wear face coverings in all public buildings and public transport. Further advice to the education sector means that face coverings must be worn at the College in all communal areas, walkways etc. but not in classrooms.

9/12/21 In line with the Government's announcement, the college will be continuing with face 2 face delivery up to and including Wednesday 15th December 2021. If your role is non-delivery and can be carried out at home, we recommend that you arrange to work from home with effect from Monday 13th December 2021. Additionally, Staff requested to continue to test through the holiday period and prior to return in January. Tests, as always, available through reception. The DfE recommend vaccinations for all, especially staff working within educational environments. The college now ask that all visitors are to conduct a Lateral Flow test prior to visiting the College. Following receipt of the Government issued Carbon Monoxide monitors these will be positioned in classrooms and heavily population staff rooms. They will be in the rooms for a minimum of two weeks and then moved onto other areas. Staff are to observe the monitors and increase ventilation if required.

4/1/22 Following a Government announcement some changes were introduced ready for the start of the Spring Term.

21/1/22 Following advice from the government "to align with today's Plan B announcement. This includes the removal of the recommendation to wear face coverings in teaching settings and communal areas, that mandatory certification will no longer be in place and that people are no longer advised to work from home if they can". 27/1/22 All measures under the governments 'plan B' have been lifted therefore we return to the lower level of 'plan A' meaning face coverings are not required in College unless We would like to request that all staff and students continue to test twice weekly at home, with lateral flow device (LFD) test kits, 3 to 4 days apart. Testing remains voluntary but is strongly encouraged and as previously, test kits are available from main reception, in the Fleet building.
