

Economic pressures




- Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is estimated to have fallen by 0.3% in August 2022.
- The latest inflation rate hit >10% and is expected to rise further through the remainder of 2022
- 1-in-10 UK businesses reported a moderate-to-severe risk of insolvency. Total company insolvencies in the second quarter of 2022 reached their highest quarterly level since late 2009 - driven by Creditors Voluntary Liquidations.
- Rising prices have largely eroded any increases in (nominal) wages.
- UK wages are now only 4% higher than then they were in 2015 in real terms, and the high inflation that has been building over much of 2022 has meant that real wages have actually declined through the year.

Employers response

The Bank of England reported that:

- Companies' hiring plans slowed and recruitment difficulties stabilised and there are signs of slowing staff turnover as employees are becoming more cautious about changing jobs.
- Many companies continued to struggle to find staff.
- Businesses still wanted to retain skilled people but slowing the pace of recruitment, reducing hours, redeploying staff or not replacing leavers.
- Pay awards continued to increase, with more firms offering one-off payments to offset rising living costs. Nominal pay inflation averaged around 6% real wage growth expected to be negligible/negative.










Employment by sector

% of employed in Dorset


















2015 - 2021 Change

















Domains of Deprivation - % of Dorset neighbourhoods among the top 10% most deprived nationally














Education levels

What is the government response?

- Skills Boot Camps 12-16 week courses to upskill or skill the workforce in technical skills needed by business.
- Apprenticeship promotion focus on driving the benefits of apprenticeships for all.
- Local Skills Improvement Plans strategic technical education (L3) planning through Employer Relationship Bodies to deliver targeted output for local businesses
- **Mid-life MOT's** DWP funded initiative to work with 40+ workforce to ensure sustainable employment, financial planning and wellbeing through to retirement.
- Multiply flexible funding to support numeracy skills across the population age 16+
- **UK Social Prosperity Fund 2024/25** skills funding anticipated to local authorities
- Restart Programme DWP funded flagship programme providing coaching, skills, workshops for unemployed workforce
- Local Skills Improvement Fund c.£98m strategic fund for L3 providers to deliver LSIP outcomes
